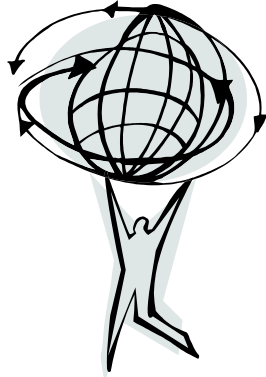

# The Tuberculin Skin Testing (TST) Workshop

## Description

This 4 hour workshop is recommended for health care personnel to strengthen their skills in administering, reading and recording the Mantoux Tuberculin Skin Test. Participants must perform Tuberculin Skin Testing as a part of their regular job requirements. This course is not recommended for beginning skin testers.

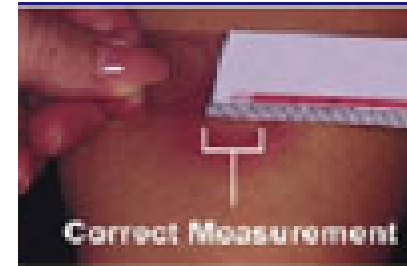


In addition to a detailed presentation and practicum on Mantoux skin testing, this workshop covers all aspects of TB including; history, epidemiology, transmission, pathogenesis, diagnosis, treatment and prevention.

## Details

- The TST workshop is offered throughout the year at a variety of locations at no charge to the participants. It is sponsored by the American Lung Association of Michigan and the Michigan Department of Community Health.
- TST certification will be awarded upon successful completion of this course, which is recommended by the Michigan Advisory Committee on the Elimination of Tuberculosis.
- Provides improved competency and standardization of the Mantoux Tuberculin Skin Testing technique.
- No commercial support is being received for this event. The planners and presenters have no potential conflict of interest.
- This 4 hour educational activity has been approved for 3.4 contact hours.
- Recertification, a 2 hour course, is recommended after two years. This course is available for 1.8 contact hours.
